Who are we?

TalentEd brings together expert teachers and bright students from low income backgrounds in small groups to improve grades and future options.

The Programme

TalentEd sessions run for two hours after school every week over three terms. Every session starts with food and conversation, followed by carefully planned interactive tasks and reflection. Sessions are not subject-specific and TalentEd provides all session plans and resources to support tutors. Students develop self-awareness, study skills, aspirations and the ability to pursue future options.

How can you help?

TalentEd needs qualified teachers who have two hours each week to offer personalised support and extra attention to six bright young people from low income backgrounds. In this role you will use your years of experience in education to build relationships with the same six students. Each week you will coach, mentor and reflect with your group to support them to achieve their potential.

Responsibilities and Commitment

- Support a group of six bright Year 10 students
- Two hours per week at one of our partner schools (after school on the same day each week)
- A commitment of 1 full academic year
- Read session plans (provided by TalentEd) in advance, tailoring them to students if desired
- Complete a short online feedback form following sessions
- Send TalentEd monthly invoices for your sessions
